## **PSALM 103**

Bless the Lord, O my soul. O Lord my God, You have been greatly magnified: You are clothed in confession and majesty. You put on light as a garment; You stretch out the heavens like a curtain, and cover its lofts with water; You lay the clouds to stand on; You walk upon the wings of the wind. You make Your angels spirits and Your ministers a flame of fire. You established the earth on its assurance; it shall never be moved. The deep covers it like a garment. The waters will stand on the mountains. At Your rebuke they will flee; at the sound of Your thunder they will be afraid. Mountains rise and valleys sink to the place which You appointed for them. You set a boundary that neither shall cross. They will not return to cover the earth. You make springs gush forth in the valleys; the waters will run between the mountains. **Deacon:** Again we pray for the blessed and ever-memorable Orthodox Patriarchs, for the founders of this holy temple (or this holy monastery) and for all Orthodox Christians departed this life before us, who here and everywhere lie asleep in the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (3 times).

**Deacon:** Again we pray for mercy, life, peace, health, salvation, God's visitation and the forgiveness and remission of sins for the servants of God, the parishioners of this holy temple.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (3 times).

**Deacon:** Again we pray for those who bring offerings and do good works in this holy and all-venerable temple; for those who labour and those who sing; and for all the people here present, who await Your great and abundant mercy.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (3 times).

The PRIEST reads the Prayer of Fervent Supplication:

O Lord our God, accept this fervent supplication from Your servants, have mercy on us according to Your great mercy and send down Your bounties upon us and upon all Your people who await the rich mercy that comes from You.

**Deacon:** Let us the faithful, pray for the catechumens, that the Lord will have mercy on them.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That He will enlighten them with the Word of Truth.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That He will reveal to them the Gospel of Righteousness.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That He will unite them to His Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: Help them, save them, have mercy on them and protect them, O God, by Your

grace.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** Catechumens, bow your heads to the Lord.

**Choir:** To You, O Lord.

# The Priest reads the Prayer for the Catechumens:

O God our God, The Creator and Maker of all things, who wishes that all men should be saved, and come to the knowledge of the truth: look upon Your servants the catechumens, and deliver them from their former delusion and from the wiles of the adversary. And call them unto life eternal, enlightening their souls and bodies, and numbering them with Your rational flock, which is called by Your holy Name.

**Priest:** That with us they may also glorify Your most honourable and majestic Name, of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

Through Tuesday of the fourth week of the Great Fast, we use the following dismissal of the catechumens:

**Deacon:** All catechumens depart. Catechumens, depart. Let none of the catechumens remain...

And then we continue with the first Litany of the Faithful, below \*\*.

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But from Wednesday of the fourth week, after the preceding exclamation of the Priest: "That with us they may also glorify..." the following petitions and dismissal are said by the Deacon.

**Deacon:** All catechumens depart. Catechumens, depart. As many as are preparing for illumination, draw near. Pray, you who are preparing for illumination.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** All the faithful, for the brethren who are preparing for holy illumination and for their salvation, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: That the Lord our God may establish and strengthen them, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That He may enlighten them with the light of knowledge and piety, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That He may vouchsafe unto them, in due time, the laver of regeneration, the remission of sins, and the robe of incorruption, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That He may beget them by water and the Spirit, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That He may be stow upon them the perfection of the Faith, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That He may number them with His holy and elect flock, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** Save them, have mercy upon them, help them, and keep them, O God, by Your grace.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** All that are preparing for illumination, bow your heads unto the Lord.

Choir: To You, O Lord.

And the PRIEST reads the Prayer for Those Preparing for Holy Illumination:

Shine, O Master, Your countenance upon those who are preparing for holy illumination, and who long to shake off the defilement of sin. Enlighten their minds. Secure them in the Faith. Establish them in hope. Perfect them in love. Show them to be honourable members of Your Christ, Who gave Himself as a deliverance for our souls.

**Priest:** For You are our illumination, and to You do we send up glory, to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

**Deacon:** All that are preparing for illumination, depart. You who are preparing for illumination, depart. All catechumens, depart. Let none of the catechumens remain . . .

And those preparing for Holy illumination leave the temple.

This concludes the inserted addition.

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## THE FIRST LITANY OF THE FAITHFUL \*\*

**Deacon:...** Let us, the faithful, again and again, in peace, pray unto the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: Help us, save us, have mercy on us and protect us, O God, by Your grace.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** Wisdom!

The Priest reads the First Prayer of the Faithful:

O God, great and praiseworthy, Who by the life-creating death of Your Christ, have translated us out of corruption into incorruption: do free all our senses from deadly passions; set over them, as a good governor, the understanding that is within us. And let our eyes

abstain from every evil sight, our hearing be inaccessible to idle words, and our tongues purged of unseemly speech. Purify our lips, which praise You, O Lord; make our hands to refrain from base deeds, and to work only that which is well-pleasing unto You, securing all our members and our minds by Your grace.

**Priest:** For to You are due all glory, honour and worship: to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

### THE SECOND LITANY OF THE FAITHFUL

**Deacon**: Again and again, in peace, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

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If a Priest serves without a Deacon, the following four petitions are omitted.

**Deacon:** For the peace from above and for the salvation of our souls, let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** For the peace of the whole world, for the good estate of the holy churches of God and for the union of all, let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** For this holy house and for those who enter with faith, reverence and the fear of God, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** For our deliverance from all affliction, wrath, danger and necessity, let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

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**Deacon:** Help us, save us, have mercy on us and protect us, O God, by Your grace.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** Wisdom!

The Priest reads the Second Prayer of the Faithful:

O Master, holy and exceedingly good, we implore You, Who are rich in mercy: be gracious unto us sinners, and make us worthy of the reception of Your Only-Begotten Son and our God, the King of Glory. For, behold, His immaculate Body and life-creating Blood, entering at this present hour, are about to be set forth on this mystical table, escorted invisibly by multitudes of heavenly hosts. Grant us to partake of Them without condemnation, that through Them the sight of our mind may be illumined, and that we may become children of the light and of the day.

**Priest:** That ever guarded by Your Might, we may send up glory to You: to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

#### THE CHERUBIC HYMN

**Choir:** Now the Hosts of heaven invisibly worship with us; for behold, the King of Glory enters in. Behold, the accomplished mystical sacrifice is being escorted in.

The Great Entrance is made in silence.

THE FAITHFUL MAKE A FULL PROSTRATION, and they remain prostrate until the Priest has entered the Altar.

After the Priest and Deacon have entered the Altar the people arise, and the CHOIR sings:

**Choir:** With faith and love let us draw near, that we may become partakers of eternal life. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

#### PRAYER OF SAINT EPHRAIM THE SYRIAN

O Lord and Master of my life! The spirit of sloth, despair, lust of power and idle talk, grant me not.

The Priest and all present make a prostration.

Grant rather the spirit of chastity, humility, patience and love, to me, your servant.

The Priest and all present make a prostration.

Yes, Lord and King! Grant me to see my own sins, and not to judge my brother, for You are blessed unto the ages of ages. Amen.

The Priest and all present make a prostration.

### LITANY BEFORE THE LORD'S PRAYER

**Deacon:** Let us complete our evening prayer to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** For the precious Gifts offered and presanctified, let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That our God, Who loves mankind, having received them on His holy, heavenly, and ideal altar as an offering of spiritual fragrance, may in return send upon us divine grace and the gift of the Holy Spirit, let us pray.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** For our deliverance from all affliction, wrath, danger, and distress, let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** Help us, save us, have mercy on us and protect us, O God, by Your grace.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** That this whole day may be perfect, holy, peaceful and sinless, let us ask of the Lord.

Choir: Grant this, O Lord.

**Deacon:** An angel of peace, a faithful guide, a guardian of our souls and bodies, let us ask of the Lord.

Choir: Grant this, O Lord.

**Deacon:** Forgiveness and remission of our sins and transgressions, let us ask of the Lord.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

Deacon: All that is good and beneficial for our souls and peace for the world, let us ask of the

Lord.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

Deacon: That we may complete the remaining time of our life in peace and repentance, let us

ask of the Lord.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

**Deacon:** A Christian end to our life - painless, blameless and peaceful and a good defense before the dread judgment seat of Christ, let us ask.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

**Deacon:** Having asked for the unity of the faith and the communion of the Holy Spirit, let us commend ourselves and one another and all our life unto Christ our God.

**Choir:** To You, O Lord.

The Priest prays:

O God of unutterable and unseen Mysteries, in Whom are the hidden treasures of wisdom and knowledge, Who has revealed the ministry of this liturgy to us, and has, through Your great love for man, set us sinners to offer unto You gifts and sacrifices, for our sins and for the errors of the people: O invisible King, who does things great and unfathomable, glorious and marvelous, which cannot be numbered, look upon us, who stand before this holy Altar, as before Your Cherubic Throne, upon which rests Your Only-Begotten Son and our God, in the dread Mysteries which are set forth. Having freed all of us and all Your faithful people from impurity, sanctify our souls and bodies with the sanctification which cannot be taken away, that partaking with a clean conscience, with faces unashamed, with heart illumined, of these Divine, sanctified Things, and by Them being given life, we may be united to Your Christ Himself, our true God, Who has said: Whoso eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood abides in Me and I in him; that with Your Word, O Lord, dwelling within us and abiding among us, we may become a temple of Your all-holy and worshipful Spirit, redeemed from every diabolical wile, wrought either by deed or word or thought, and may obtain the good things promised us, with all Your saints, who from ages past have been well-pleasing unto You.

**Priest:** And make us worthy, O Master, with boldness and without condemnation to dare call on You, the Heavenly God, as Father, and to say:

## THE FAITHFUL KNEEL DURING THE LORD'S PRAYER

**Choir:** Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy Will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

**Priest:** For Thine is the Kingdom and the power and the glory, of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

Priest: Peace be unto all. Choir: And to your spirit.

**Deacon:** Let us bow our heads to the Lord.

**Choir:** To You, O Lord.

The Priest reads the Prayer at the bowing of the heads:

O God, Who alone are good and compassionate, Who dwells in the Highest, Who looks upon the humble: look with Your compassionate eye upon all Your people and keep them. And make us all worthy without condemnation to partake of these Your life-creating Mysteries, for unto You have we bowed our heads, awaiting from You Your rich mercy.

**Exclamation:** Through the grace, mercy, and love for mankind of Your Only-Begotten Son, with Whom You are blessed, together with Your All-Holy, Good, and Life-Creating Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

The Priest washes his hands and says the following prayer quietly:

Attend, O Lord Jesus Christ, our God, out of Your holy dwelling place, from the Throne of the Glory of Your Kingdom, and come to sanctify us. You, Who sit on high with the Father and are also invisibly present among us; grant that by Your own Mighty Hand, Your Pure Body and Precious Blood might be given to us, and through us, to all the people.

**Deacon:** Let us be attentive.

**Priest:** The Presanctified Holy things for the holy.

**Choir:** One is Holy, One is Lord, Jesus Christ, to the glory of God the Father. Amen.

## **COMMUNION HYMN**

Choir: O taste and see that the Lord is good. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

If it be a feast on which the Epistle and Gospel are read, the choir chants a second Communion Hymn.

Following the communion of the clergy, the Deacon opens the curtain and the Royal Doors, receives the chalice from the Priest, and intones:

**Deacon:** With fear of God, faith, and love, draw near.

All the faithful make a prostration.

Choir: I will bless the Lord at all times. His praise shall be on my lips.

The PRIEST, standing in the Holy Doors facing the people, says the Communion Prayer, and all communicants recite this prayer together with the Priest.

#### PRAYER BEFORE HOLY COMMUNION

I believe, O Lord and I confess that You are truly the Christ, the Son of the Living God, Who came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am first. I also believe that this is truly Your Own Most-Pure Body and that this is truly Your Own Precious Blood. Therefore, I pray to You: have mercy on me and forgive my transgressions - both voluntary and involuntary, of word and of deed, committed in knowledge or in ignorance and make me worthy to partake without condemnation of Your Most-Pure Mysteries for the remission of sins and for eternal life. Amen.

Of Your Mystical Supper, O Son of God, receive me today as a communicant, for I will not speak of Your Mysteries to Your enemies, neither like Judas will I give You a kiss; but like the Thief will I confess You: Remember me, O Lord, in Your Kingdom.

May the communion of Your Holy Mysteries, O Lord, be neither to my judgment nor condemnation, but unto the healing of soul and body. Amen.

After the communion of the faithful, the PRIEST enters the holy Altar, places the Holy Gifts on the Holy Table, turns towards the people, and blesses them with his hand, saying:

**Priest:** Save Your people, O God, and bless Your inheritance.

**Choir:** Taste the heavenly bread and the cup of Life, and see how good the Lord is. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Priest: (quietly): Blessed is our God.

And turning to the Royal Doors, blessing the people with the Holy Chalice, he says aloud:

**Priest:** Always, now and ever and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen. Let our mouths be filled with Your praise, O Lord, that we may sing of Your glory; for You have made us worthy to partake of Your Holy Divine, Immortal and Life-Giving Mysteries. Keep us in Your holiness, that all day long we may meditate upon Your righteousness. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

# THE LITANY OF THANKSGIVING

**Deacon:** Let us stand aright. Having partaken of the Divine, Holy, Most-pure, Immortal, Heavenly, Life-Giving and Awesome Mysteries of Christ, let us worthily give thanks unto the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** Help us, save us, have mercy on us and protect us, O God, by Your grace.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

**Deacon:** Having asked that the whole day be perfect, holy, peaceful and sinless, let us commend ourselves, and one another, and all our life unto Christ our God.

**Choir:** To You, O Lord.

# The Priest says the Prayer of Thanksgiving:

We give thanks unto You, O Saviour, God of all, for all the good things You have granted unto us, and for the communion of the holy Body and Blood of Your Christ, and we pray You, O manbefriending Master, keep us under the shelter of Your wings, and grant that even unto our last breath we may worthily partake of Your holy things, unto illumination of soul and body, unto inheritance of the kingdom of heaven.

**Priest:** For You are our sanctification and to You we give glory: to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

Priest: Let us depart in peace.

Choir: In the name of the Lord.

Deacon: Let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

## THE PRAYER BEHIND THE AMBON

**Priest:** O Almighty Master, Who has made all created things in wisdom, and by Your inexpressible providence and great goodness has brought us to these all-venerable days, for the purification of body and soul, for the controlling of passions, and for the hope of the Resurrection; Who, during the forty days did give into the hand of Your servant Moses the tablets of the Law in characters divinely traced by You: Enable us also, O Good One, to fight the good fight; to accomplish the course of the fast; to preserve inviolate the Faith; to crush under foot the heads of invisible serpents; to be accounted victors over sin; and uncondemned to attain unto and adore the holy Resurrection.

For blessed and glorified is Your all-honourable and majestic name, of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen. Blessed be the Name of the Lord, henceforth and forevermore. (3 times)

# The priest quietly reads the prayer for the consuming of the Holy Gifts:

Choir: Amen.
