Tone 6 Kondak Melody (Sung at many Divine Liturgies as the Theotokian Kondak after the tropars p. 259)

"The singing of tropars and kondaks usually concluded by the singing of a kondak in honour of the Theotokos, in the sixth tone: *Protection of Christians*, or by another kondak, as prescribed by the *Typicon*." (*Ridna Nyva 2008 p. 29, Note 8.*) The other kondak is usually one belonging to a feast or a special festal Theotokian kondak.
